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### Agenda 34.1 - Welcome

#### **Introduction of the Members of newly Constituted Governing Body**

The 33<sup>rd</sup> Governing Body Meeting (Online/Offline) was convened on 18<sup>th</sup> December 2021, at 11.00 am in the college. Dr. S Nataraju, Member Secretary welcomed and introduced the members of the newly constituted G B. The services of the past members were recollected and were thanked for their contribution and cooperation extended throughout their tenure.

The Member Secretary requested Hon'ble Sri. Justice Subhash Adi, to Chair the meeting in the place of the Chairperson, The agenda and the consequent deliberations are as follows:

#### Agenda 34.2:

Subject: Reading and recording the proceedings of the 33<sup>rd</sup> Governing Body Meeting held on 6<sup>th</sup> July 2021.

The proceeding of the 33rd Governing Body meeting held on 6<sup>th</sup> July 2021 was once again brought to the notice of the members. As there were no objections or clarifications, the member secretary requested to accord and approval of the same. It was accepted.

### **Agenda 34.3:**

**Subject: Action Taken Report on the 33rd Governing Body meeting.** 

**Note:** The action taken on the decisions of the 33<sup>rd</sup> GB meeting held on 6<sup>th</sup> July 2021 was placed before the members for consideration. The resolutions passed and decisions taken are on the previous body meeting are as follows:

# Agenda 33.3: The approval of 27th Academic Council recommendations.

**Resolution**: It was resolved to start Value Added Courses from the academic year 2021-22.

#### **Action taken:**

- Value added courses namely; Physical Education and Yoga, and Computer Applications, has been implemented from the academic year 2021-22.
- SWAYAM/MOOC courses for the UG students is introduced from 2021-22 and it has already been implemented for the PG students from the academic year 2019-20.

# Agenda 33.4: The approval of suggestions of the 19th Finance Committee

**Resolution**: It was resolved to enhance the library budget to Rs.7 lakh per year.

#### **Action taken:**

The same has been communicated to MVP for approval of the same as it is mandatory according to BCI.

Agenda 33.5: The approval of nominations to the various Statutory Bodies by the AC.

**Resolution**: The Nominations of Members for various Statutory Bodies for the academic year

2021- 2024 were placed for its approval.

Action taken:

The approved nominations have been notified and the nominees have been contacted in this

regard.

**Agenda 33.8: Any other matter** - (i) the approval of submission of AQAR & SSR preparation.

**Resolution**: It was resolved to prepare and submit AQAR for finalizing the SSR.

Action taken:

The criteria wise preparation records are underway under the supervision of the Principal.

**Note:** During the deliberations of the action taken report Prof. K.S. Suresh explained the details

of two value added courses which have been implemented from this academic year and also

about the two alumni who got selected for JAG (Judge Advocate General).

Regarding the library budget (2020-21), it was clarified that the JSSMVP would approve the

budget allocation of Rs.7 lakhs to the library.

**Decision: Noted and approved.** 

**Agenda 34.4:** 

**Subject: Placing the Recommendations of Academic Council** 

**Note:** The recommendations made by the Academic Council meeting held on 27, November

2021 are as follows:

Introduction of Certificate Course on Public Policy.

• The need for integration of law papers with non-law papers for the pre-law students.

Taking up minor and major research projects by faculty from different funding

agencies.

Decision: The above recommendations were approved.

Agenda 34.5:

**Subject: Approval of Recommendations of Finance Committee** 

**Note:** The budgetary allocation for the library was increased to Rs.7,00,000. However, The BCI

prescribes Rs. 12,00,000/- as the mandatory budget allocation for all Law Colleges. It was

unanimously resolved and recommended for enhancement of the budget. Prof. K.S. Suresh

briefed the necessity of enhancing the budget since, the Institution has to comply and

implement the suggestions and recommendations of BCI and KSLU norms. He also requested to

consider the recommendations of the Finance Committee before finalising the budgetary

allocation from the Finance Section. Further, he briefed the financial requirement of the

college, in view of the forthcoming renewal of both permanent Affiliation & Autonomy from

UGC, and also for NAAC accreditation purpose. Dr. C.G. Betsurmath has agreed and assured to

consider the same.

A revision in the sitting fee for members of various statutory bodies was placed for approval.

Decision: It was accepted.

Agenda 34.6:

**Subject: Results-August/September-2021:** 

**Note:** The results of the end semester examinations were placed before the Members and it

was demonstrated through a chart and graph analysis by comparing the results of the previous

semester. Prof. K S Suresh clarified how results would vary from one semester to other and

also results vary based on the core law papers in different semesters. Prof. K.S.Suresh

explained to the Chairperson about the system of evaluation incorporated in our college.

Dr. C.G. Betsurmath, Executive Secretary, suggested introducing online evaluation system as it

is followed in JSSAHER, Mysuru, as it will speed up the evaluation process and facilitates early

declaration of results. Prof. K. S. Suresh clarified that, it is not feasible for a single faculty

college as it involves huge expenses, and the student number is limited.

**Decision: It was noted.** 

Agenda 33.7:

Subject: Half Yearly Report (August 2021 – December 2021):

**Note:** The activities conducted from August to December 2021 were briefed to the members.

The major events, conferences, seminars, workshops organised, teachers and students

achievements in various competitions were brought to the notice of the members.

Hon'ble Sri. Justice Subhash Adi sought the information about the MYCAB (Mysuru Citizens

Advisory Bureau). The details of the activities carried out through this Forum were explained to

the members by Prof. M.P. Nagendramurthy, coordinator of the Forum. Further, during the

discussions about the Orientation Programme organised for the Fresher's, Hon'ble Sri. Justice

Subhash Adi narrated about the importance of Ratio Decidendi and its relevancy while

interpreting the judgments of higher judiciary. He suggested guiding the students about the

technicalities, significance and application of Ratio decidendi in a case by referring to the

leading cases. Prof. K.S. Suresh briefed about how we can make the students learn about such

aspects, further he clarified that the components have been taught in jurisprudence, it has also

been included in seminar paper and moot court activities. Further, he expressed the difficulty

of NAAC accreditation norms especially while assessing Autonomous law Colleges on certain

aspects and presently NAAC has introduced a new Manual for Law Colleges for Accreditation

which will be implemented shortly by the NAAC.

Decision: It was acknowledged.

Agenda: 34.8

**Subject: Any other matter with the permission of the Chair:** 

**Note:** The proposal for Inclusion of JSS Law College under JSS Science and Technology, SJCE

Campus Mysuru and also for progressive disaffiliation from KSLU was submitted before the

Governing Body. In this regard, Hon'ble Justice Sri Subhash Adi Sir insisted to start one more

Law college from JSS University as there is dearth of excellence in Law colleges; which was

agreed by the members. Dr.V.Vijaykumar also suggested that, it is the need of the hour to go

for affiliation from the Parent University so that, it will save lot of time and avoid delay in the

affiliation process from the Conventional University. In this regard, Dr. C.G. Betsurmath,

Executive Secretary informed the Members that, the requisition made by JSSLC was approved

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by the management and has directed the college to follow the norms and process involved for joining the JSS Science and Technology University, Mysuru. Dr. C.G. Betsurmath, Executive Secretary suggested to bring out the print law journal by inviting articles from the Students and Staff and other institutions. In this regard, the Principal clarified that, JSSLC Journal of Law, Volume-I has already been released and we are awaiting for RNI registration process and ISSN number. Further, the Annual AQAR report submitted to NAAC was briefed to the members for their information.

#### Decision: It was accepted.

Dr. S. Nataraju, Principal & Member Secretary proposed the vote of thanks and sought the guidance and support of the members to enhance the academic and curricular performances of the College.

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
